### JSTOR Terms and Conditions of Service

#### [...]5. Prohibited Uses of Content

In addition to agreeing to any Content-Specific Terms and Conditions of Use, you agree that you will not:

- a) use or authorize the use of the JSTOR Platform or Content for commercial purposes or gains, including charging a fee-for-service for the use of JSTOR beyond reasonable printing or administrative costs. For purposes of clarification, "commercial purposes or gains" shall not include research whose end-use is commercial in nature.
- (b) except as set forth in Section 2.1(e) and 5 of the Terms and Conditions for Use for Journals, Plants, GIS Data, Select Other Content Types, and Data for Research below, provide and/or authorize access to the Content available through Individual Access, the Publisher Sales Service, or other programs to persons or entities other than Authorized Users;
- (c) attempt to override, circumvent, or disable any encryption features or software protections employed in the JSTOR Platform;
- (d) undertake any activity such as computer programs that automatically download or export Content, commonly known as web robots, spiders, crawlers, wanderers or accelerators that may interfere with, disrupt or otherwise burden the JSTOR server(s) or any third-party server(s) being used or accessed in connection with JSTOR; or
- (e) make any use, display, performance, reproduction, or distribution that exceeds or violates these Terms and Conditions of Service and the Content-Specific Terms and Conditions of Use. [...]

#### [...]7. Responsibilities of Authorized Users

7.1 Authorized Users are responsible for maintaining the confidentiality and security of their username and/or password (if such are provided), and for all usage or activity by them of JSTOR. Except as permitted for certain Content, Authorized Users may not provide access to JSTOR to anyone else, including by setting up an anonymous remailer for purposes of allowing access to JSTOR.

7.2 Authorized Users promptly shall notify JSTOR and, where applicable, their affiliated Institutional Licensee, of any known or suspected unauthorized use(s) of their account or JSTOR, or any known or suspected breach of security, including 1055, theft, or unauthorized disclosure or use of their username, password, and/or IP address. Any use of JSTOR beyond the scope or in violation of these Terms and Conditions of Service or Content-Specific Terms and Conditions of Use, knowing use of any password or username of another, or any fraudulent, abusive, or otherwise illegal activity, may be grounds for termination of an Authorized Users account, or termination of access to JSTOR from their IP address, without notice and at JSTOR's sole discretion.

7.3 Where Authorized Users are able to submit material and/or post comments to JSTOR, Authorized Users represent and warrant that they will not upload or otherwise publish through JSTOR any materials that:

- (a) are protected by copyright, or other proprietary or intellectual property rights;
- (b) are libelous, defamatory, obscene, pornographic, abusive, or invasive of another's privacy or hateful; or
- (c) contain a virus, spyware, or other harmful component, advertising of any kind, or false or misleading indications of origin or statements of fact. Authorized Users acknowledge and agree that any material that they submit or comment that they post may be edited, removed, modified, and/or published by JSTOR without notice. Authorized Users agree to indemnify and hold JSTOR harmless from any and all liability and costs incurred in connection with any claim arising out of their breach of the foregoing representations and warranties. Authorized Users will cooperate as fully as reasonably required in the defense of any claim. JSTOR reserves the right, at its own expense, to assume the exclusive defense and control of any matter subject to indemnification by Authorized Users. [...]

## Terms and Conditions for Use for Journals, Plants, GIS Data, Select Other Content Types, and Data for Research

### [...]2. Uses of Licensed Content.

2.1. Permitted Uses, Institutional Licensees and/or Authorized Users (as defined in the JSTOR Terms and Conditions of Service) may search, view, reproduce, display, download, print, perform, and distribute Licensed Content for the following Permitted Uses, provided they abide by the restrictions in Sections 3 and elsewhere in these Terms and Conditions and the JSTOR Terms and Conditions of Service. Permitted Uses may be undertaken within the premises of an

Authorized Users affiliated Institutional Licensee. Except in the case of Authorized Users who are Walk-In Users, Permitted Uses also may be undertaken remotely through secure access methods:

- (a) research activities;
- (b) classroom or organizational instruction and related classroom or organizational activities;
- (c) student assignments;
- (d) as part of a scholarly, cultural, educational or organizational presentation or workshop, if such use conforms to the customary and usual practice in the field;
- (e) authors or other Content creators may at their discretion incorporate their Content into unrestricted databases or website with prior permission from the publisher and other applicable rights holders;
- (f) linking (see Section 4 below);  
and for Content other than Register & Read Content:
  - (g) on an ad hoc basis and without commercial gain or in a manner that would substitute for direct access to the Content via services offered by JSTOR, sharing discrete Textual Content or Global Plants Content for purposes of collaboration, comment, or the scholarly exchange of ideas;
  - (h) downloading Textual Content to view, use and display including on a personal digital device (e.g. mobile devices, e-readers, and personal computers);
  - (i) in research papers or dissertations, including reproductions of the dissertations, provided such reproductions are only for personal use, library deposit, and/or use solely within the institution(s) with which the Authorized User and/or his or her faculty readers are affiliated; and
  - (j) Regarding Textual Content and Global Plants Content, fair use under Section 107 of the U.S. Copyright Act, educational exceptions, or other similar provisions of the copyright laws or other intellectual property right laws in the United States or in other countries.

2.2 Should an Institutional Participation Agreement or JPASS Agreement terminate or expire, the Institutional Licensee's affiliated Authorized Users or the JPASS User may continue making use of Books, Textual Content and Global Plants Content that have been downloaded or printed out. Likewise, users who purchase content through the Publisher Sates Service (including purchased Register & Read Content) may continue to make use of downloaded or printed out copies of the content. In such cases, such uses of downloaded or printed out

content shall comply with these Content-Specific Terms and Conditions of Use, which shall survive the termination of access under the Institutional Participation Agreement or other user agreement.

2.3 Additional Permitted Uses of Data for research, Institutional Licensee and/or Authorized Users (as defined in the JSTOR Terms and Conditions of Service) may use Data for research to perform research activities involving computational analysis rather than for purposes of understanding the intellectual meaning of such content. Institutional Licensees and or Authorized Users may search, view, reproduce, display, download, print perform, and distribute Data for Research for the following Permitted Uses, provided they abide by the restrictions set forth in Section 3 and elsewhere described in these Terms and Conditions of Use and the JSTOR Terms and Conditions of Service:

- (a) searching the JSTOR archive using the Data for Research search function;
- (b) downloading chart data to view, use and display as Excel-compatible CSV files;
- (c) viewing document-level data including word frequencies, citations, key terms and ngrams;
- (d) requesting and downloading datasets containing word frequencies, citations, key terms, or ngrams associated with the Data for Research selected; and
- (e) subject to registration with JSTOR, using the REST API for content selection retrieval.

### 3. Prohibited Uses.

Institutions and users may not:

- (a) modify, ,obscure, or remove any copyright notice or other attribution included in the Content;
- (b) attempt to override, circumvent or disable any encryption features or software protections employed in the JSTOR Platform;
- (c) incorporate Content into an unrestricted database or website, except as provided in 2.1(e) above;
- (d) systematically print out or download Content to stock or replace print

holdings;

- (e) make any use, display, performance, reproduction, or distribution that exceeds or violates these Terms and Conditions of Service or the Content-Specific Terms and Conditions of Use;
- (f) download or print, or attempt to download or print an entire issue of a journal (unless such entire issue has been purchased through the Publishers Sales Service) or substantial portions of the entire run of a journal, except for the specific case in which the complete contents of a journal issue or a substantial portion of Textual Content (e.g. a series of scholarly essays) is relevant to the particular research;
- (g) undertake coordinated or systematic activity between or among two or more individuals and/or entities that, in the aggregate, constitutes downloading and/or distributing a significant portion of the Content; or
- (h) reproduce or distribute Content in bulk, such as the inclusion of Content including portions of Content (e.g. individual articles and/or journal issues) or Content in course packs, electronic reserves, repositories, or organizational intranets (but see Section 4, below).
